## Authentic Assessment

Authentic assessment is an assessment technique that directly assesses a child using "real world" tasks. It aims to more accurately determine the supports the child needs in order to better access the curriculum. Authentic assessment is collected in the student's natural learning environment, by several team members, from multiple tasks in different contexts, and it is collected over time.

The CPA helps clinicians and educators describe a student's most important language-learning needs through a solution-focused process.
