Dismissing a Student from Special Education

Before dismissing a student from special education, the student must be comprehensively reevaluated to determine if he/she is no longer a student with a disability who requires special education and related services. Comprehensive reevaluation may not necessarily require doing a complete battery of tests, but may only require looking at available data which creates a profile of the student's strengths and weaknesses. An IEP meeting must be held and the eligibility form must be completed. Parents must be provided with a copy of the eligibility form. However, a reevaluation is not needed under any of the following circumstances: 1. When the student graduates from high school with a regular education diploma. An IEP meeting must be held and a Summary of Performance should be provided to the student and/or parent.

When the student has exceeded the age of eligibility (22nd birthday) for a free appropriate public education (FAPE). An IEP meeting must be held and a Summary of Performance should be provided to the student and/or parent.
When the parent revokes consent for special education services. A prior written notice should be provided to the parent. Use the prior written notice form available on the Exceptional Education website. Keep the notice in the student's folder.
