Activities to Facilitate Core Vocabulary Development

Reading & Writing

- Word wall
- Message of the day
- Graph (e.g., "Do you like pizza?" yes/no)
- Writing words that children recall from previous activities or discussions
 - make use of wipe boards, paper, letter stamps, chalkboards (writing center materials)
- Reading books
 - find target vocabulary words in books you read in class
 - use new vocabulary through story re-tellings

Listening – Expression

- Lotto boards
- Story box
- Dice games (words/pictures on dice)
- Concept books
- Toys/Games:
 - theme related magnet boards
 - cariboo game
 - potato head
 - classification magnet games
 - sorting games (sort specific items/objects into their respective categories)
 - simon says
 - hide 'n seek
 - question board (e.g., what shape is it, what does it do?)
 - camouflage game (e.g., show friends part of a picture see if they can guess what it is, give clues to what it is based on function, features, class)
 - counting jar (e.g., introduce important vocabulary words everyday)
 - adaptive books
 - bingo boards

Facilitating Core Vocabulary Learning in the Classroom

Circle Time:

- Routines:
 - calendar patterns: use to teach concepts such as size, spatial, category name, etc.
 - weather: use sentence strips: "It is __." "It is not __.", gives opportunity to teach negation and yes/no question form vocabulary
 - flag: teaches right/left, colors, country
 - jobs: gives opportunities to teach gender and pronoun vocabulary

Center Time:

- Art Center:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to: color, size, shape, function, texture, right/left
- Sensory Table:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to: descriptive concepts (color, size, shape, texture, same/different), verbs, quantity, gender (possession, pronouns)
- Table Toys:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to units of study through use of lotto boards, bingo boards, dice games, magnet boards, puzzles
- Book Center:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to units of study through use of story box, social stories, stories the kids write
- Block Center:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to spatial concepts, descriptive concepts, categories items belong to, gender (possession, pronouns), verbs, function of items
- Pretend Center:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to categories items belong to, verbs, spatial concepts, descriptive concepts, wh-question forms,
- Writing Center:
 - Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to spatial concepts, categories, descriptive concepts, verbs

Story Time

 Opportunities for exposure to print and word acquisition, concepts of left to right progression, sequential concepts of first/then, and response to and comprehension of wh-questions

Music Time

• Opportunities for exposure to a variety of vocabulary including actions, body parts, descriptive concepts (fast/slow, loud/soft, colors, etc.)

Motor Time

Opportunities to teach verbs, spatial concepts, descriptive concepts, opposites

Snack Time

• Opportunities to teach vocabulary related to descriptive concepts (including same/different), categories, verbs, gender (possession and pronouns), wh-question forms

Clean-Up Time

• Opportunities to teach comparison concepts (same/different), categorical names, wh-question forms, generate associations (e.g., what goes together)
